BOUNDARY OF ELIGIBILITY

North: 626 Avenue (MD of Foothills)

South: TWP 134 (MD Willow Creek)

East: Little Bow River (As of MD of Willow Creek/MD Foothills map)

West: BC Border (no population issues)

RULE: If you live outside the physical boundary, you must apply to the Board of Directors and Executive of the Nanton Nite Rodeo Club to be able to participate. There is no longer a Grandfather Clause. If you or your family were once participants, but you live outside the boundaries, you must apply for an exemption. You only need to apply once, not every year. If you live within the boundaries, you may compete in the NNR.

Rough Stock Events:

If rough stock events are NOT filled with local entries, the event will be open to competitors who live outside the boundary. There will be no female competitors allowed to compete in Bull Riding, Saddle Bronc, or Bareback riding.

Boys Steer Riding: Contestants must be 9 years of age or older and 14 years of age or under as of January 1st of the rodeo season.

Roping Events

Adult/Child Team Roping:

- The child of the pair must be 14 years of age or under as of January 1st of the rodeo season.

- The child contestant cannot enter the open roping if they enter the Adult-Child.
- A participant can only enter one time per rodeo (e.g. One adult cannot rope with two separate kids at one rodeo)

Calf Roping

- “Busting” a calf will be an automatic NO TIME (Unnecessary roughness to the calf). The executive or directors can call the penalty, not just the flagman.
- Time limit 30 seconds

Breakaway Roping

- Open BAW is open to all ladies
- JR BAW open to contestants 14 years of age or under as of January 1st of the rodeo season. • Contestants will be allowed ONE LOOP, and the catch pen gate will be open.
- The loop must go all the way over the calf’s headfirst but can break anywhere after that. We will use the rules outlined in the AHSRA rulebook for a legal catch.
- Time limit 30 seconds

Team Roping

- There will be only one go of Team Roping
- Contestants may only enter once per rodeo
- Open Gate
- Time limit 30 seconds

BARREL RACING

Novice Barrels:

- Age limit is 10 years of age or under as of January 1st of the rodeo season.
- Contestants must be able to ride on their own. They may not be led on foot or horseback.
- If a contestant wins the buckle in the Novice Barrels OR earns more than 100 points on the season** they must move up to the Junior Barrels the following Season.
- Novice competitors cannot enter the Junior Barrel Racing.

Junior Barrels:

- 14 years of age or under as of January 1st of the rodeo season.

Senior Barrels:

- 15 years of age or over as of January 1st of the rodeo season.

POLE BENDING

Novice Poles:

- Age limit is 10 years of age or under as of January 1st of the rodeo season.
- Contestants must be able to ride on their own. They may not be led on foot or horseback.

- If a contestant wins the buckle in the Novice Poles OR earns more than 100 points on the season** they must move up to the Junior Poles the following Season.

- Novice competitors cannot enter the Junior Pole Bending.

Junior Poles:

- Junior Poles is 14 years of age or under as of January 1st of the rodeo

season. **Senior Poles:**

- Senior Poles is 15 years of age or over as of January 1st of the rodeo

season. ● Rules will follow AHSRA

WILD PONY RACE:

- Age limit is 12 years of age or under as of January 1st of the rodeo season. And at least 7 years old as of January 1st of the rodeo season

PRIZES AND PAYOUT

- Contestants must buy a Nanton Nite Membership to compete

- If there are no qualified times, the money will go back to the Nanton Nite

Rodeo** ● All ground money will go back to the Nanton Nite Rodeo**

- A Buckle will be awarded to the contestant who earns the most points in the event. A Reserve

Champion prize will be given to the contestant who earns the second most points in an event. (changed in 2021)

- You must attend at least three rodeos to be eligible for prizes.

- If you are a CPRA card holder, you are not eligible for payout or prizes (Considered an exhibition) **Payout:**

20 plus---40/30/20/10

10-19 ---50-30-20

3-9---60-40

2 or less---100 pay 1 spot.

Points:

1st - 40pts

2nd - 30 pts

3rd - 20 pts

4th - 10pts

Tie breakers:

- If two contestants are tied for the MOST points in an event, there will be a run-off immediately after the event to determine the winner.

- If two contestants are tied for 2nd place, then the contestant who attended the most rodeos will win the tiebreaker. If it is still tied, it goes to the fastest single time over the six rodeos.

Sr. membership \$100 or Sign Up to help at rodeo and ONLY pay \$50 for membership. (must fulfill duty or a NT will be given- no exceptions)

Senior Poles and Barrels \$40

Senior BAW \$40

Open Team Roping \$40

Adult/Child Team Roping \$40

Junior Membership \$25 (MUST ALSO HELP OR HAVE A PARENT HELP AT A RODEO) Junior Poles and Barrels \$20

Junior BAW \$30

Novice Barrels \$10

Novice Poles \$10

Rough stock \$40 with \$10 stock fee holdback

\$10 stock fee deducted for rough stock and roping events.

\$10 Ground fee per contestant in Jr. and Sr. Poles and Barrels deducted out of the entry fee.

CPRA Card holders can only exhibition in events that they compete in at the professional rodeo level. CPRA card holders are eligible to compete for prizes and money in events that they do not compete in at the professional level. In the events they exhibition in 50% of the entry fee will go to

the pot and 50% will be kept to go toward year end prizes and rodeo expenses.

CPRA permit holders are eligible to compete for prizes and money in all events at the Nanton Nite Rodeos
